



Headteacher's Weekly Update: Friday 14th November

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have had a great week. It has certainly been a busy one in school with a wonderful variety of events and activities. Here are a few highlights and all link to this half term's focus on Power for Good, reflecting on the fact that we all have the power and opportunity to do great good in the world around us...

Odd Socks Day and Anti Bullying Week: With a range of dedicated lessons and assemblies as well as some delightfully odd socks, the children have thought hard about how we have the power to stand against bullying and how we have the power in what we say, how we listen, how we practically show kindness with our hands and our time to do much good in supporting those around us who are not being treated with respect or kindness by others.

Armistice Day: On Tuesday, we were so impressed by how immaculately the children observed the two minute silence of remembrance and reflected on the courage of those who have served or are serving their country. We stood together for the silence as Armistice translates as to "stand still" and cease fighting. We stood together to remember the courageous sacrifice of others and give thanks but also to remember that we can stand together as a community for hope and peace and cease the fighting and arguments we can so easily get drawn into in our daily lives.

School Council and Eco Warrior Elections: The children have exercised their democratic power this week in voting for their new class school councillors and Eco Warriors. The new teams will be busy helping our school grow and flourish and ensure all children have a voice into how our school develops and works. They are already buzzing with ideas.

Children in Need: Thank you for all your donations to Children in Need this week. You have raised an enormous £568 for the work of Children in Need, surpassing last year's total which itself was an incredible effort. It is amazing for the children to be part of achieving something together and making a big difference in the lives of others. At the time of writing I have completed 21,400 meters of running today with a very soggy run at lunchtime which lots of children joined me with until the rain started falling too heavily. I will complete the remaining 3,600 meters of the challenge at 3:15pm today and you and your children are welcome to join me on the track if you'd like. I am feeling very nervous about the rope climbing challenge but we are all very excited about seeing the staff take on various challenges at 2:30pm today.
