

## **INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT (VARIATION)**

- 1. The name of the school is Romsey Abbey Church of England Primary School
- 2. The school is a voluntary aided school
- 3. There is a trust deed for the school dated 12 April 1852
- 4. The name of the governing body is "The governing body of Romsey Abbey Church of England Primary School"
- 5. The governing body shall consist of:
  - a. Two parent governors [at least two parent governors]
  - b. One local authority governor
  - c. One staff governor
  - d. The Headteacher
  - e. One co-opted governor [Such number as the governing body consider necessary. The total number of co-opted governors who are eligible to be elected as staff governors under Schedule 2, when counted with the staff governor and the headteacher, must not exceed one third of the total membership of the governing body]
  - f. Eight foundation governors [Such number as to outnumber all the other governors by two]

Total number of governors: Fourteen

- 7. The foundation body entitled to appoint the foundation governors is the Winchester Diocesan Board of Education after consultation with the Parochial Church Council of Romsey Abbey (the Parish Church of St Mary and St Ethelflaeda)
- 8. (a) the holder of the following office shall be a foundation governor ex-officio; The principal officiating minister of Romsey Abbey (the Parish of St Mary and St Ethelflaeda)
  - (b) The Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry within which the school is situated shall be entitled to appoint a foundation governor to act in the place of the exofficio foundation governor whose governorship derives from the office named in (a) above, in the event that that ex-officio foundation governor is unable or unwilling to act as a foundation governor, or has been removed from office under regulation 21 (1) of the Regulations or there is a vacancy in the office by virtue of which this governorship exists.

- 9. The Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry within which the school is situated is entitled to request the removal of any ex-officio foundation governor and to appoint a substitute governor
- 10. Recognising its historic foundation, the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan level.

The school aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils.

- 12. This instrument of government comes into effect on 10 February 2015.
- 13. This instrument was made by order of Hampshire Local Authority on 27 January 2015
- 14. A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body (and the head teacher if not a governor), any trustees and to the appropriate religious body.
