Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy May to you all. I hope you have had a good week and been able to enjoy the sunshine and warm weather to some degree this week.

Collaboration Counts: We continue to explore what being a great team looks like, reflecting on the image from 1 Corinthians 12 in the Bible about one body with many parts and each part having its purpose and role to play. Verses 17 and 18 state: *"If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be."* One of the collaboration questions from our shared language is, **"How can you help the team?"** Whether that team is our class in school or our family at home, positively encouraging each other to think about how we can each help the teams we are in is really worthwhile. A strong sense of purpose and belonging are so valuable and powerful. How can you help the team?

Safety at drop off and collection: An important reminder to all, whether driving or walking to school to take extra care in and around the Abbey car park and Church Lane at the start and end of the school day to keep each other safe. Please be particularly mindful of children on scooters and bikes. It is unavoidably a busy time so please take extra care and time and be alert.

Please also **refrain from parking on Church Lane immediately outside our neighbour's drive** as there have been a number of occasions where they have not been able to get in or out of their drive because someone has parked on the yellow lines opposite their driveway.

Wildflower Meadow: As you will have seen the Abbey's wildflower meadow is really flourishing at the moment. It is a wonderful space and will bloom beautifully over the coming months. The Abbey has asked us to remind children to stick to the pathways through the meadow rather than plough through the flowers so that it can grow happily. Thank you!

PE Kit Shorts: On PE days for KS2 when they come into school in PE kits, please can you ensure that shorts come at least halfway down the thigh. In the summer, a number of girls have been keen to wear some very short shorts but where they are in their PE kits all day we ask that they have shorts that come at least halfway down the thigh.
