Flying High Together: A couple of highlights that have encouraged and inspired this week...

Y5 Romsey Abbey Sleepover: Sycamore Tree Class were utterly amazing as they enjoyed a day and a night spent in the beauty, peace and historic majesty of Romsey Abbey. They discovered how Romsey's history is very much shaped by the Abbey and explored the lives and experiences of nuns and tradesman families around 1000 years ago. Thank you to Rob Gower, who provided excellent historical expertise, to the bell ringers for letting Year 5 go up to the bell tower and teaching them to ring the bells across Romsey. Thank you to Rev Thomas and Martin Seymour for wowing the children with the organ and leading the class in an evening candlelit service of thanksgiving.
